

EMPLOYMENT

Institute for Defense Analyses 400 Army Navy Drive Arlington, Virginia July 23, 1962 - October 23, 1964

The following investigation was conducted by SA H. ALLEN WITZGALL and SA THOMAS E. TIERNEY on February 25, 1970, at Arlington, Virginia:

KENNETH L. RENKE, Security Officer, Institute for Defense Analyses, advised his security file reflects that HARALD, BERNARD MALMGREN, born July 13, 1935, Boston, Massachusetts, Social Security Number 1543, was granted a top secret security clearance on July 9, 1962, by the Inspector of Naval Material, which is now DISCO. He advised his file contains no derogatory information on MALMGREN.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FEL. It is the property of the FEL and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

AX 161-403

K. P. DOLAN, Assistant Personnel Officer, IDA, advised that his files reflect that HARALD BERNARD MALMGREN was employed at IDA as an economist from July 23, 1962, to October 23, 1964, at which time he was given a leave of absence to work with the Office of Special Representatives for Trade Negotiations, Executive Office of the President. His employment was officially terminated on August 31, 1967. DOLAN advised the appointee's personnel file contains no performance ratings but he would assume the appointee performed satisfactorily as all his pay raises were granted on time. His file contains no derogatory information and the appointee is eligible for rehire.

JAMES E. CROSS, Secretary for IDA stated that he was the appointee's supervisor from the summer of 1963 to October, 1964. He stated he has a very high opinion of the appointee's intelligence and professional abilities and has never had any reason to question the appointee's character, reputation, or loyalty to the U. S. Government. He advised that he had given the appointee increased responsibility and supervision over two or three men on different occasions and found him to be a very tactful and understanding supervisor. He stated the appointee was a very reliable worker. He advised he did not know anything about the appointee's personal life but on one occasion had heard one rumor that the appointee was having some trouble with his wife or another woman. He stated he did not pursue this matter with the appointee and it never affected the appointee's work. He could not remember where he had heard this rumor and he, himself, did not feel it was a true statement. CROSS stated he would highly recommend the appointee for a position of trust and responsibility with the U. S. Government.

ROLF R. PIEKARZ, Senior Economist, IDA, stated he was the appointee's co-worker from July, 1962, to October, 1964, and knew him both professionally and socially. He found him to be a very reliable and hardworking individual who took a great deal of interest in his work. He stated the appointee had a great deal of stamina and he had known the appointee to work through the night on different economic problems. He feels the appointee is highly qualified as an economist and has never had any reason to question the appointee's character, reputation, or loyalty. He has met several of the appointee's associates on various occasions and has always found them to be mature and responsible individuals. He has never known the appointee to drink excessively and has found him to always act in a responsible and respectable manner. He stated he would highly recommend the appointee for a position of trust and responsibility with the U. S. Government.

CIA CHECK

SA ARNOLD L. PARHAM caused a search to be made of the files of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) and was advised on February 25, 1970, that the files contained no pertinent identifiable information concerning PATRICIA ANN MALMGREN.

NIS CHECK

On February 25, 1970, IC JOHN B. ARMSTRONG reviewed the appointee's record at Naval Investigative Service Headquarters (NISHQ), Hoffman Building, Alexandria, Virginia.

This record reveals that on July 5, 1962, Office of Secretary of Defense, requested investigation of the appointee to determine suitability for access to classified material. This investigation was closed in May, 1965, no derogatory information developed.

ARREST CHECK

IC JOHN B. ARMSTRONG caused a search to be made of the files of the Arlington County, Virginia, Police Department and was advised on February 19, 1970, that no record was located concerning the appointee.

HARALD BERNARD MALMGREN

THE INVESTIGATION OF DR. MALMGREN COVERED INQUIRIES IN THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES AS TO HIS CHARACTER, LOYALTY, ABILITY, AND GENERAL STANDING, BUT NO INQUIRIES WERE MADE AS TO THE SOURCES OF HIS INCOME.

I. BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Birth

Dr. Malmgren was born on July 13, 1935, in Boston, Massachusetts. The records of the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Boston, Massachusetts, list his name as Harold Bernard Malmgren.

Education

Dr. Malmgren attended Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Troy, New York, from September, 1953, to June, 1954.

He attended Yale University, New Haven, Connecticut, from September, 1954, to June, 1957, when he was graduated summa cum laude, receiving a B.A. degree.

Dr. Malmgren reportedly attended Oxford University, Oxford, England, from October, 1957, to June, 1958, and from January, 1959, to August, 1961, receiving a Ph.D. degree.

He attended the Harvard University Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, Cambridge, Massachusetts, from September, 1958, to January, 1959, majoring in economics.

Employment

Summers of 1952 to 1955 Dr. Malmgren reportedly had various jobs as a laborer, draftsman, and house painter. No records are available concerning these employments.

Summer of 1956

Minneapolis-Honeywell, now Honeywell, Incorporated, Minneapolis, Minnesota, as an office worker on a temporary basis

Summers of 1958 and 1959

He was reportedly employed as a consultant in England and Turkey by the Hudson Valley Steel Erection Company, Incorporated, New York, New York.

1961-1962 academic year

Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, as an Assistant Professor of Economics

March, 1962, to July, 1962

The Rand Corporation, Santa Monica, California, as a consultant on a part-time basis

July, 1962, to August, 1967 Institute for Defense Analyses, Arlington, Virginia, as an economist. He was on a leave of absence from October, 1964, to August, 1967.

October, 1964, to the present

Office of the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations, Executive Office of the President, Washington, D. C., as an economist until July, 1969. Since July, 1969, Dr. Malmgren has served as a consultant.

July, 1969, to the present Overseas Development Council, Washington, D. C., as a junior fellow

In addition to the foregoing, Dr. Malmgren was employed by the Department of State as a consultant from October, 1963, to August, 1966. He has been employed as an instructor at Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies, Washington, D. C., on a part-time basis since 1965.

Marital Status

Dr. Malmgren is married to the former Patricia Ann Nelson. They reside at 6917 Woodside Place, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

II. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

Interviews

Thomas C. Schelling, Professor of Economics, Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts, stated he has been very well acquainted with Dr. Malmgren since Dr. Malmgren was a student in his classes at Yale University, New Haven, Connecticut. He said Dr. Malmgren performed research work for him and assisted him in editing a textbook on economics while at Yale University. He advised they were later associates at the Institute for Defense Analyses, Arlington, Virginia. Dr. Schelling stated Dr. Malmgren, who studied at Oxford University, Oxford, England, is a brilliant economist who is stable, productive, and responsible. He described Dr. Malmgren as "first-rate" in every respect and said he considers him a loyal American of excellent character, reputation, morals, and associates. Dr. Schelling recommended him as a fine choice for a position of responsibility with the Government.

Alfred Kahn, Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, advised he was acquainted with Dr. Malmgren at Cornell University in 1961 and 1962. He described him as an exceptionally able economist and stated he is a man of fine character whose loyalty is above reproach. Dr. Kahn mentioned that during the latter part of Dr. Malmgren's employment at Cornell University, he did not devote all of his energies to teaching, and this resulted in complaints from a few students. He said he believes Dr. Malmgren was seeking other employment at that time. He advised that based on his knowledge of Dr. Malmgren, he would highly recommend him for a position of trust with the Government.

George Adams, Professor of Economics, Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, advised he recalls Dr. Malmgren as a former member of the faculty of Cornell University in the Department of Economics. He described Dr. Malmgren as a good economist and said he had no reason to question his character, loyalty, or morals. Professor Adams stated Dr. Malmgren was a

vain and arrogant person who was disliked by his students at Cornell University. He advised he considered him to be a poor teacher. He said he would recommend Dr. Malmgren for a position of trust, but would not recommend him for a position in which he would be required to deal with people.

James E. Cross, Secretary, Institute for Defense Analyses, Arlington, Virginia, advised he was Dr. Malmgren's supervisor at the Institute for Defense Analyses from the Summer of 1963 to October, 1964. He described Dr. Malmgren as a very reliable worker and stated he has a very high opinion of his intelligence and professional abilities. He said he gave Dr. Malmgren increased responsibilities, including supervision over two or three men, on various occasions, and he found Dr. Malmgren to be a very tactful and understanding supervisor. Mr. Cross advised that Dr. Malmgren gave him no reason to question his character, loyalty, or reputation. He mentioned that on one occasion he heard a rumor indicating Dr. Malmgren may have been having marital difficulties. He stated he does not recall the source of his information in this regard and said he does not believe there was any truth to this rumor. Mr. Cross advised that, to the best of his knowledge, at that time Dr. Malmgren was happily married. He stated he would highly recommend him for a position of trust and responsibility with the Government.

Theodore R. Gates, Assistant Special Representative for Industry and Labor, Office of the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations, Executive Office of the President, Washington, D. C., advised he hired Dr. Malmgren in October 1964, and said they worked together closely until July, 1969. He stated Dr. Malmgren is extremely bright and a very hard worker who is dedicated and capable. According to Mr. Gates, Dr. Malmgren has a somewhat abrasive personality, in that he treats some individuals as inferiors and "makes it clear" he desires to deal only with people in high positions. He advised, however, that in his opinion Dr. Malmgren's talents more than compensate for this personality trait and he performed very effective work. He said he considers Dr. Malmgren to be a stable individual, and stated he has no reason to question his character, reputation, loyalty, or associates. Mr. Gates recommended Dr. Malmgren for a position of trust and confidence.

John W. Evans, Special Assistant to the Special Representative, Office of the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations, Executive Office of the President, Washington, D. C., advised he worked quite closely with Dr. Malmgren from early 1966 to July, 1969. He said Dr. Malmgren, a highly intelligent and able person, is a rather ambitious man who likes to assume responsibility. Mr. Evans stated he observed that Dr. Malmgren had personality clashes with some of his associates in the Office of the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations; however, he possesses no details concerning such clashes. He described Dr. Malmgren as very stable and responsible, and said he is a hard worker who performs his work well and effectively. He added that he is not acquainted with Dr. Malmgren on a social basis. Mr. Evans advised he would recommend him for a position of trust and confidence.

Morton Pomeranz, Executive Secretary, Trade Executive Committee, Office of the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations, Executive Office of the President. Washington, D. C., advised he has been professionally and socially acquainted with Dr. Malmgren since 1966. He described him as a very intelligent, able, and quite ambitious young man. He stated he questioned Dr. Malmgren's judgment because of the way he talked to people on occasion. In this connection, Mr. Pomeranz advised that within one month after Dr. Malmgren ceased active employment with the Office of the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations, and while he was on the rolls as a consultant, he made a speech in which he "blasted" the European Common Market countries for their agricultural policies. Mr. Pomeranz said he agreed with Dr. Malmgren's comments; however, he did not feel they should have been made by an individual who was employed in the capacity of a representative of the United States Government. He described Dr. Malmgren as a very courageous person, but stated he feels he lacks some maturity of judgment. Mr. Pomeranz advised he has no question concerning Dr. Malmgren's character, loyalty, reputation, or associates, and said he would definitely recommend him for a position of trust and confidence.

Lester Brown, Senior Fellow for Agriculture, Overseas Development Council, Washington, D. C., advised that he employed Dr. Malmgren in July, 1969, in view of his reputation as a very intelligent man and a talented writer. He described Dr. Malmgren as an exceptional worker with tremendous ability and stated he is very dedicated to his work. Mr. Brown commented

favorably as to Dr. Malmgren's character, loyalty, and reputation. He said Dr. Malmgren is doing commendable work in his present position, and advised he would highly recommend him for a position of trust with the Government.

Twenty-three additional persons, including Dr. Malmgren's professional associates, social acquaintances, and references, were interviewed during this investigation. They commented favorably regarding his character, loyalty, reputation, and associates, and advised they would recommend him for employment by the Government in a position of trust and confidence. Dr. Malmgren was described by these individuals as intelligent, capable, industrious, mature, discreet, and articulate. It was stated he is energetic, knowledgeable, conscientious, and trustworthy. Persons acquainted with Dr. Malmgren's close relatives advised they are considered reputable individuals.

Harald Bernard Malmgren Credit and Arrest Checks Information has been received from the appropriate credit reporting agencies indicating their files contain either no record or no additional pertinent information concerning Dr. Malmgren. The files of appropriate law enforcement agencies were found to contain no record of Dr. Malmgren or his close relatives. Clearances During 1962, Dr. Malmgren had a secret security clearance which was issued by the Department of the Air Force in connection with his employment by The Rand Corporation. Santa Monica, California, Dr. Malmgren was granted a top secret security clearance by the Department of the Navy on July 9, 1962. This clearance terminated on August 31, 1967. He was granted a top secret security clearance by the Department of State in October, 1963. This clearance terminated in August, 1966. He was granted a top secret security clearance by the Office of the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations, Executive Office of the President, on November 18, 1964, and this clearance is presently active. Agency Checks The files of the Bureau of Personnel Investigations, Civil Service Commission, indicate that during an investigation conducted by the Civil Service Commission concerning Dr. Malmgren in 1965, Frank H. Golay, Professor of Economics, Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, was interviewed. He stated Dr. Malmgren was employed as an Assistant Professor of Economics at Cornell University when he, Dr. Golay, was Acting Chairman of the Department of Economics. He described Dr. Malmgren as a very successful teacher who enjoyed a good professional reputation. He added that Dr. Malmgren was efficient and thorough, and stated he was resourceful and responsible in planning and coordinating his work. comments concerning Dr. Malmgren's character, loyalty, integrity, morals, and conduct. Dr. Golay reportedly furnished the following additional comments: "I would say that his capacity for administration is not extremely high, but as an economist his performance would be very successful. At times, he had difficulty in communicating with his contemporaries, as he has an arrogant nature. He was somewhat contemptuous of his colleagues, and tended to be pretentious of his capabilities. I would say that his performance amounted to approximately one-half of his claimed ability. However, I feel that he has the essential qualifications to perform his duties successfully." The files of the Bureau of Personnel Investigations, Civil Service Commission, contain no additional pertinent information concerning Dr. Malmgren.

During this investigation it was ascertained that Dr. Frank H. Golay is presently overseas.

According to the files of the Office of Security, Department of State, in June, 1963, Dr. Malmgren furnished information to the effect that in about 1960 or 1961 he and several other American Rhodes scholars at Oxford University. Oxford, England, signed an open letter to the President of the United States. He advised this letter stated that the dictatorship in Cuba was no different than any other dictatorship and that the signers did not think American intervention in Cuba was warranted at that time. Dr. Malmgren advised in June. 1963, that he no longer felt the way he did when he signed this letter. Investigation conducted by the Department of State in England and Turkey concerning Dr. Malmgren in 1963 developed no information of an unfavorable nature concerning him. The files of the Office of Security, Department of State, contain no additional pertinent information concerning Dr. Malmgren.

Information has been received from the following governmental agencies indicating their files contain either no record or no additional pertinent information concerning Dr. Malmgren:



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
